# Modules

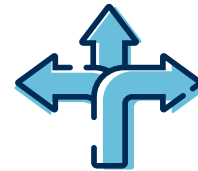

# Entry requirements

## Academic entry requirements

- A UK first or second class (2:2) Honours degree, or equivalent internationally recognised qualification in any subject
- Applicants with other degrees and subjects, with relevant work experience, will be considered on an individual basis

## Non-native speakers of English need one of the following:

- IELTS: 6.5 (min 6 in all areas)
- Pearson: 59 (59 in all sub scores)
- BrunELT: 63% (min 58% in all areas)
- TOEFL: 90 (min 20 in all)

## Application documents:

1. A completed application form
2. Passport copy
3. Personal statement
4. Scanned copies of your education certificates and transcripts
5. Your CV/Resume in English
6. Proof of English proficiency
